• Feedback on Curriculum

IQAC collected online Curriculum feedback which was analyzed and shared with respective departments. This helps us to update curriculum that is more socially relevant which focuses on employability, skill development and entrepreneurship.

3. Teaching & Learning

Teaching Plans are collected from individual teachers and verified by Vice- Principal. Due to Covid-19 pandemic there was online teaching for the students. The teachers were trained by IQAC to use Zoom application, Microsoft team, Edfly, Google classroom and Google forms for online teaching process. Students were provided with links of online lectures, notes in word and PDF format, video lectures, e-books, e-journals on WhatsApp, Gmail. Teachers

prepared their own PPTs, video lectures. Few of science practicals were conducted virtually with the help of VLABS, IIT Bombay.

Faculty members also organized various activities like internship, projects, socially innovative projects, article writing, essay writing, industrial visits, field visits for experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies based learning process.

IQAC collected online feedback on teachers which was analyzed and submitted to Principal for further action.

4. Evaluation & Results

In this academic year, examinations were conducted under institutional autonomy only for first year of UG and PG courses. The examination pattern followed is 70:30. The continuous internal examination for first year courses was conducted online for 30% marks and SEE for 70% marks, as per the statute accepted and approved by the Governing body and Academic Council.

It was challenging for the institution to conduct examination in online mode as per the guidelines of University and State government under COVID-19 situation, because of various social and economic background of stakeholders. The institution took this challenge as an opportunity and successfully conducted online internal examination for the first time with integration of IT with some reforms in traditional examination system. Teachers used Google forms to design multiple choice questions. Some of the departments collected hand written answer sheets through Google forms and Gmail in PDF format.

Similarly the SEE (Semester End Examination) was conducted at the end of both terms with the help of CIMS Master Soft ERP Solutions Pvt. Ltd. Utmost care was taken by CoE and his team to facilitate students to appear for online exam. The departments used Zoom/MS Teams platforms to conduct practical examinations.
